

RESOLUTION NO. 91-11-7-1

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE TENAJA COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT APPROVING MEASURE AND SETTING A DATE FOR A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON FEBRUARY 11, 1992, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF SAID DISTRICT A PROPOSITION TO AUTHORIZE THE EXERCISE OF CERTAIN POWERS RELATING TO PUBLIC RECREATION GRANTED BY SENATE BILL NO. 767, AND REQUESTING THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF RIVERSIDE COUNTY TO PERMIT THE REGISTRAR OF VOTERS TO CONDUCT SUCH AN ELECTION.

WHEREAS, Senate Bill No. 767 empowers Community Services Districts to exercise powers relating to "[P]ublic recreation, including, but not limited to, aquatic parks and recreational harbors, equestrian trails, playgrounds, golf courses, swimming pools, or recreational buildings."; and

"WHEREAS, the Board finds that the adoption of the aforesaid additional powers by the Tenaja Community Services District is feasible, economically sound, and in the public interest: and"

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors wish to set a special election for the voters of the Tenaja Community Services District to consider the adoption by the District of such powers; and

WHEREAS, a special mail ballot election, in accordance with Section 1340, et. seq., of the Elections Code, is planned to be held on the 11th day of February, 1992; and

WHEREAS, in the course of the said election and in relation thereto it will be necessary to mail ballots and arguments to the resident voters within the Tenaja Community Services District, and it will facilitate such mailing if the Registrar of Voters of the County of Riverside will print such documents, insert them into envelopes with the names and addresses of the voters of said District thereon and place all envelopes in zip-coded mail bags, prepare PDO Form 3602, "Statement of Mailing Matter with Permit Imprints", to mail said ballots and to do all other work necessary to conduct said election; and

WHEREAS, all necessary expense in performing this service will be paid by said District;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Directors of the Tenaja Community Services District does hereby resolve that:

1. A special election be and is hereby called to be held in the Tenaja Community Services District on the 11th day of February, 1992, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of said district the measure hereinafter set forth, which measure is hereby approved.

If the measure receives the requisite number of votes, to wit: a majority of the electors residing within the Tenaja

Community Services District, the said District shall be empowered to exercise powers relating to "[P]ublic recreation, including, but not limited to, aquatic parks and recreational harbors, equestrian trails, playgrounds, golf courses, swimming pools, or recreational buildings."

2. The measure to be submitted to the qualified electors of the Tenaja Community Services District is:

3. A cross (+) placed in the voting square after the word "YES" in the manner hereinbefore provided shall be counted in favor of the adoption of the question or proposition. A cross (+) placed in the voting square after the word "NO" in the manner hereinbefore provided shall be counted against the adoption of the question or proposition.

4. The special election shall be held as an all mailed ballot. The ballots for the special election shall be distributed by mail, with return postage prepaid, to the resident voters of the Tenaja Community Services District. The ballots must be received at the office of the Registrar of Voters at 1260 Palmyrita, Riverside, California 92507 in person or by mail not later than 8:00 p.m. on February 11, 1992.

5. That in all particulars not recited in this resolution, said election shall be held and conducted in accordance with the provisions of Section 4020 of the Elections Code so far as the same shall be applicable, except as otherwise provided in the Community Services District Law, as amended.

6. That pursuant to the provisions of Section 22003 of the Elections Code of the State of California, this Board of Directors hereby requests the Board of Supervisors of said County to permit the Registrar of Voters to perform all functions necessary to conduct the special election for the Tenaja Community Services District including the functions set forth in the recitals hereof.

7. That said District shall reimburse said County for services performed when the work is completed and upon presentation to the District of a properly approved bill.

8. That the Secretary is hereby directed to forward to said Board of Supervisors and to said Registrar of Voters, each a certified copy of this Resolution.

9. That the Registrar of Voters shall cause a notice of the election to be published once a week for two (2) successive weeks prior to the date of the election in the THE CALIFORNIAN, there being no newspaper being printed and published in the Assessment District.

2. Notice of Special Election and Measure to be Voted On shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation selected by the Registrar of Voters pursuant to Section 2554 of the California Elections Code.

3. Vote upon the Measure shall be by mailed written ballot pursuant to §§ 1000 and 1350 of the Elections Code.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the General Manager be and is hereby authorized and directed to coordinate the election procedures with the office of the County Registrar of Voters of the County of Riverside.

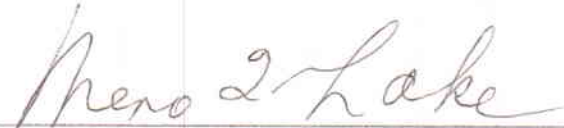
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors directs the District Secretary to forward a copy of this resolution to the Riverside County Auditor.
